Alison Lee Freeman has recordings available for purchase at Folkweb.com, CDBaby.com, and online music services like Apple iTunes.

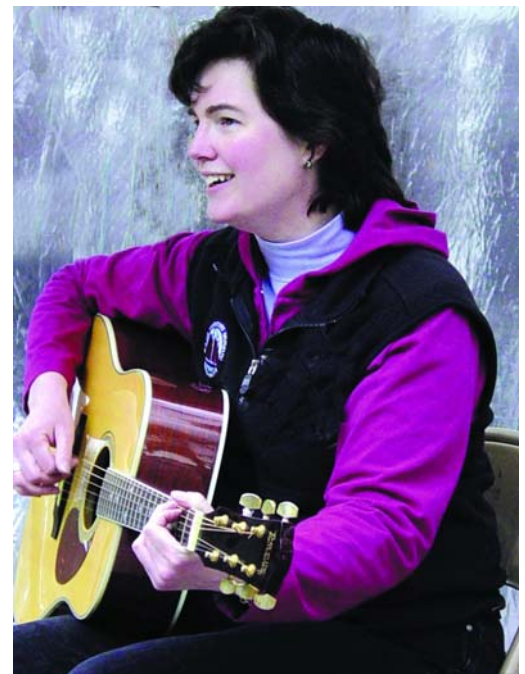
